



Winetinerary: Ste. Genevieve, Missouri

The charming community of [Ste. Genevieve](#) is nestled on the west bank of the Mississippi River just 60 miles south of St. Louis. French settlers began growing grapes in this area in the early 1700s. Today, their impact is apparent in the region's architecture, museums and wineries. Whether you're looking to explore history, a quaint downtown or journey into the countryside, Ste. Genevieve has the perfect Missouri wine to pair with your adventure!

The Ste. Genevieve area also has its own wine trail, the [Route du Vin](#). Be sure to check for wine trail events before you begin your journey to the area – with six wineries on the trail and multiple events per year, Route du Vin events make the perfect one day activity!

The first stop on your journey should be downtown Ste. Genevieve – full of history, quaint shops, and home to [Ste. Genevieve Winery](#). Ste. Genevieve Winery is located right downtown in a beautiful 5,000-square foot, turn-of-the century home.

Before leaving downtown, check out [Audubon's Restaurant](#) for lunch or take a tour of the historic museum [Bequette Ribault House and Hospitality Center](#)!

You'll delve into Ste. Genevieve's countryside as you make your way to [Cave Vineyard](#). Famous for their homemade biscotti (try dipping it in the wine...yum!), and their location above a natural cave, Cave Vineyard is a fun and unique stop. You can even enjoy your wine and biscotti from inside the cave!

[Crown Valley Winery](#) provides an opportunity to learn more about the winemaking process firsthand on daily guided tours of their production facility and vineyards. [Charleville Vineyard Winery & Microbrewery](#) is another must see on your journey, offering panoramic view of some of the highest points in Ste. Genevieve County (and delicious Missouri wines!).

When you start getting hungry for dinner, make your way to [Chaumette Vineyards & Winery](#). Chaumette's Grapevine Grill Restaurant pairs Chaumette wines perfectly with unique culinary creations made with locally sourced ingredients.
