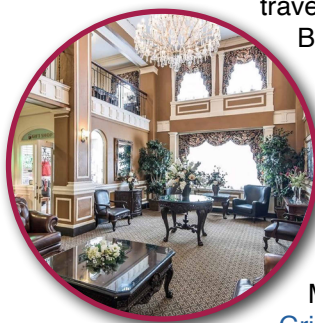

While many are familiar with Sedalia as the home of the Missouri State Fair, Sedalia itself has historic significance that can be appreciated. During the days of the MKT rail line, Sedalia served as an important stop; today, visitors can participate in self-guided tours of the [Katy Depot and Visitor Center](#) to learn about the history of the rail line in Missouri. While you're at the Depot, embark on the [Sedalia Heritage Trail Tour](#) to experience life in 1861 on the prairie. For travelers who desire cultural attractions, the [Daum Museum of Contemporary Art](#) offers a large permanent collection of art to be enjoyed by the community, as well as three exhibition cycles for temporary art collections.

If outdoor activities are more your speed, Sedalia has much to offer. Participate in birdwatching at the 300-acre [Paint Brush Prairie Conservation Area](#) and hike or bike around the expansive [Bothwell Lodge State Historic Site](#), which was built atop two natural caves. Families looking for old-fashioned fun will enjoy the go-kart track and miniature golf offered by [Leisure Park](#). In August, the [Missouri State Fair](#) offers livestock shows, concerts, carnival rides and a showcase of all that the Show-Me State has to offer.
